

We hope that you have been able to celebrate with your child how they have **grown** throughout the year, in knowledge and skills, as well as other attributes such as resilience and kindness. Throughout this year, we hope that they have grown in **respect** for the school community and in **aspirations** as to what they can achieve in the future. As you read your children's reports in a few weeks' time, hopefully what you have seen in their books will complement and reflect what you read in their reports. Last week, we welcomed new parents to our school community. Those children who will be joining us in September will be visiting the school a few times in the next three weeks to prepare them for going to 'big' school after the holidays.

On Wednesday, at GVP we have had Hispanic Day. Each class learnt about a different Spanish-speaking country. They looked at the geography and culture of the country and learnt a little Spanish through stories and songs. In the afternoon the children learnt about an artist and created their own artwork inspired by the artist.

At GVP, we have a strong SEND team: Mrs Mooring & Miss Vincent are the SENDCos. They are supported by Mrs Redbond and Mrs Olivier. SEND stands for Special Educational Needs and Disabilities. Our SEND team work incredibly hard with teachers and teaching staff to ensure that children are well cared for and that they can thrive in school. A huge thank you to that team who care so much for those children who can find school incredibly difficult. They often go above and beyond what is expected of them.

Two of our teaching assistants, will be retiring at the end of the year: Mrs Penny Griffiths and Mrs Angela Hall. Mrs Griffiths has worked at Gamlingay Village Primary and Gamlingay First School for over 20 years. Mrs Hall has been supporting children in Gamlingay schools for over 33 years, first at the Village College and now at the Village Primary. They have commented on many happy memories, the privilege of working in schools, the vibrant school community, interesting children, genuine friendship.
